

1Co 2:2 For I determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified.

Paul knew Corinth. He knew it was a sin city. He knew about its wealth, wickedness, culture, and Greek philosophies. He knew the minds of the Jews and the Greeks who were living in Corinth: "For the Jews require a sign, and the Greeks seek after wisdom" (1 Cor 1:22). But Paul would have none of those things. He did not come to Corinth to philosophise; he came to preach Jesus. He had made up his mind that he would know nothing among them save Jesus Christ and Him crucified.

Paul's message was about Christ. Christ was the centre of all his preaching. His only concern was that Christ should be the only person the Corinthians needed to hear. Paul resolved not only to expound on Christ as the grand object of his knowledge and attention, but a "crucified" Christ. The Greeks had heard so much from their own philosophers; now, they needed to hear about Jesus and His crucifixion.

This should be the resolution of every preacher of the gospel – to preach Christ. Christianity is about Christ, and Christ is Christianity. Christ is the reason we are Christians. Christ is the only Person that can save men from their sins. Gospel preachers must preach the gospel: the gospel of Christ. They should make Christ crucified the grand object of their message.

Indeed, the preaching of the cross is the only kind of preaching that we should be hearing from the pulpit. But sadly, the denominations want to preach everything except Christ and His crucifixion. And the hearers want to hear something else. They want something more than the gospel of Christ. They want to listen to "smooth things" (Isa 30:10). They want something that tickles their ears (2 Tim 4:3). They prefer to listen to myths, fairy tales, rumours, and other stories rather than the truth (2 Tim 4:4).

Worship is about God and not self. Worship is an honour that we give to God. It is a solemn service; it is never a noisy entertainment. When Moses came down with Joshua

from Mount Sinai after receiving the two tablets containing the Ten Commandments, they heard loud noises from the camp below. Joshua thought it was the sound of a war. Moses said it was singing. It must have been some kind of rock music for it was so loud that Joshua thought there was a war going on. Well, Moses did not like it when he saw what was going on. The people were singing, shouting and dancing. In his anger, he broke the two tablets of stone (Exo 32:17-19).

The Old Testament form of worship was solemn and with reverential fear; it was never entertaining. The object of worship was always God. It was never a noisy entertainment.

Denominations have perverted the worship of God and made it into an entertainment. Worship became self-centred and not God-centred. Preaching is set aside. The gospel message has been replaced with other forms of talk shows and speeches. It does not matter if their "pastor" has been found charged and guilty of stealing money from the church treasury; they love him nonetheless because he is such a good talker.


If the apostles had not preached the doctrine of the cross, and had not made Christ crucified the great theme of their ministry, you and I would never have heard of Christianity at all. We will not be saved from our sins.

What do you want to hear from the pulpit? Do you want to hear preaching that is from the word of God or from the words of men? Are you in the worship to see a show or to listen to God's word? Do you want to know more about Jesus and His love or do you prefer to know about some Hollywood or soccer star?

Preachers, what are you preaching on Sundays? Are you preaching about Christ and His crucifixion? The commandment is for you to preach the word (2 Tim 4:2). Preach the word that can edify the saints and help them draw closer to God. Preach the word

of salvation that the unbelievers can come to know about Jesus and His dying love for them.

Brethren, what do you want to know? Do you want to know about Jesus and Him crucified? Let Christ be the centre of all the preaching we would want to hear.





Stress and Young People

Although there is some disagreement among experts as to precisely why, there is an abundance of evidence which indicates young people are experiencing a seemingly unprecedented level of stress. Psychologist Daniel Keating noted: "Depression, anxiety, and feeling overwhelmed are not all the same thing, but they do share a common feature: experiencing a level of stress that is beyond an ability to cope, with a negative impact on health and on the ability to function well in many situations" (Keating, Daniel. www.psychologytoday.com/us/blog/stressful-lives/201711/why-are-teen-so-stressed-and-what-can-be-done-to-break-the-cycle). One wonders how aware many church leaders and congregations are of the seriousness of the situation. Even more, one wonders what specific actions are being taken by church leaders to help minister to youth dealing with this issue. Admittedly, parents have a primary responsibility, but this does not mean that our young people should not find support, strength, and encouragement within the body of Christ.

Some of the major factors contributing to the stress of youth include (1) fear; (2) uncertainty; (3) lack of control; (4) competition, and (5) feelings of being socially "disconnected" or alone. For each of these factors, there's help and hope to be found in Christ, His gospel and His people! It simply is a must that Christians do what we can to help improve "the spiritual immune system" of young people. And this is because if Satan gets their hearts, bodies, and minds, he will get their souls too! (Eph. 4:27; 2 Cor. 2:11).

What can be done? We could blame our culture, or claim that young people today are too fragile or weak. But this thinking does nothing to help improve matters. It does not appear that the factors contributing to stress among young people are going away anytime soon. What can we do to help? (Phil. 4:9) Here are four suggestions. Keep in

mind that the more specific and concrete ways we positively implement these, the better. And they need to be done on both an individual and congregational level.

First, we must teach and model *faithfulness* (Matt. 22:36-40). If we're going to raise a generation of young people like Daniel, we better help them know how to have a vibrant relationship with God while living in Babylon! (Cf. Dan. 1:8; 1 Tim. 4:16). Second, we must teach and model *resilience*. Resilience will help better equip them to overcome the toxic effects of stress. If parents and churches constantly display a negative "the sky is falling" type outlook, this will not help. We must truly believe in the providential care of God (Rom. 8:28). We must believe we are "more than conquerors" through Christ (Rom. 8:37). Third, we must teach and model *mindfulness*. By this, I mean that we must help them live properly in the moment. In Philippians 3, Paul exhibits a marvelous ability to properly think in terms of the past, present and future. Do we? Young people need to better see this quality in us. Fourth, we must teach and model *care*. Appropriate care is given to the body, the mind and the soul. This involves the appropriate application of exercise, nutrition and rest in all three areas.

Christians have a marvelous opportunity to show and tell young people of the joy and peace that is to be found in Jesus (Gal. 5:22-23). We cannot remove all the factors that might cause stress in their lives, but we can help them love and trust the One who can see them through them – Jesus.
