Joh 3:7 Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again.

Nicodemus came to Jesus. Jesus told him: "Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God". Nicodemus was confused and asked, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born?"

Nicodemus was thinking in terms of the physical birth. Jesus had to explain to him: "That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit."

Obviously, this born-again experience is absolutely necessary and of the utmost importance. We cannot take it lightly, for Jesus spoke imperatively, "You must" - a command from God.

What does it mean to be born again?

It means to be saved. To be born again" carries the idea of "becoming children of God." It is to enter a new relationship with God. The sinner is dead in his sins. The apostle Paul wrote: "And you did he make alive, when ye were dead through your trespasses and sins" (Eph 2:1, ASV).

The sinner remains outside the kingdom of God. He has no salvation. He is spiritually dead. But the one who is "born again" enters the kingdom of God. Only the "saved" are in the kingdom of God (Mark 16:16; John 3:16). The "unsaved" are outside the kingdom of God.

How is one "born again"? Our Lord says the new birth is "of water and the Spirit" (John 3:5).

The "Spirit" obviously refers to the Holy Spirit. The question is, How does the Holy Spirit operate?

One thing is certain: The Holy Spirit does not operate directly on the heart of a person to make him a Christian. If He does that, He might as well operate directly on every person in this earth so that they are saved because He would be unjust if He does not do it.

But the Holy Spirit operates through His word. The Holy Spirit gives us the inspired word (2 Tim 3:16, 17). The word of God is the sword of the Spirit (Eph 6:17). The Hebrews writer wrote: "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit," (Heb 4:12).

It is the word of God, the sword of the Spirit, that pierces the soul and causes the sinner to realise his sinful condition and asks, "What must I do to be saved". On the day of Pentecost, when Peter had preached the word, the hearers were pricked in their heart and asked: "Men and brethren, what shall we do?" (Acts 2:37). The Holy Spirit did not operate directly on their hearts; it was the preaching of Peter that pricked their hearts.

Peter wrote that the new birth is by the word of God: "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever" (1 Pet 1:23).

How about the water? What does it mean to be "born of water"?

It means to be baptised. Ananias told Saul: "And now why tarriest thou? Arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on his name" (Acts 22:16). On the day of Pentecost, three thousand souls obeyed the gospel and were baptised. The passage says: "And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved" (Acts 22:47).

"To be added to the church" is the same as to "enter the kingdom of God" because the church and the kingdom are one and the same thing (Matt 16:18-19). The three thousand souls who had been baptised on Pentecost day entered the kingdom of God.

God is not in the business of "dry cleaning" as the denominations are teaching. They teach a false doctrine that one needs not be baptised to be saved. Who do you want to believe, the denominations and their false teachings or the words of our Lord Jesus?

It was our Lord who said: "Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God" (John 3:5). And He repeated it with a command: "Ye **must** be born again" (John 3:7).

Our Lord also commanded: "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16:16). Our Lord puts "shall be saved" after baptism. Paul and the Ethiopian eunuch were baptised in water (Acts 8:36-39; 22:16).

The denominations put the new birth before baptism. The apostle Paul says the new birth comes after baptism. "Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that

like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life" (Rom 6:4).

Read Romans 6:4 again and note that the new life comes *after* baptism. God is not in the business of dry cleaning a sinner; He makes sure a sinner is washed clean by water. The "new life" emerges only when a sinner comes up from the grave or water baptism; he is "born again".

And only a sinner who has been washed by water baptism is saved in the spiritual ark of God: "The like figure whereunto even baptism doth also now save us" (1 Pet 3:21).

Read again, "baptism doth now save us". Denominations say baptism does not save. Who do you want to believe – Jesus, the apostle Peter, or a denominational preacher?


